ON GUITAR: JOHN "RATSO" GERARDI



John Gerardi bought his first guitar at 7 and taught himself how to play it. By 9, he'd assembled his first band; by 14, he'd made his professional debut. In his mid-20s, he began formal guitar study with Jazz great, Sal Salvador—an apprenticeship that would span over two

decades and inspire him to become a teacher himself. He has since taught several generations of students at his *alma mater*, Greenwich High, one of whom, Ravi, toured with Hanson.

Ratso has written original music for Music Alive Records, "Sesame Street," Honda/Yamaha, scored the soundtrack to a New York indie film, and played on the American Steakhouse jingle. In 1996, he published his first book, *The Blues Bible*.

A veteran of New York City clubs The Bitter End, CBGB, Downtime, Lone Star Café, Manny's Car Wash and The Ritz—New Haven's Toad's Place and Arcadia Ballroom, Stamford's Palace Theater and Westchester's Capitol Theatre—Ratso has performed on bills with Roberta Flack, David Johanson, Eric Johnson, Al Kooper, Matt "Guitar" Murphy, Duke Robillard, The Fixx, Jimmy Vivino (of The Max Weinberg 7) and Zebra.
