He's been called everything. But whatever you call him, Tribal Tech's Scott Henderson—the L.A.-based master of improvisational guitar—is student first and teacher second.

Henderson and bassist Gary Willis formed the acclaimed electric band Triba Tech 12 years and 8 albums ago. Henderson, who credits Led Zeppelin as his greatest influence, began playing guitar at 16, getting his first start with Chick Corea and then becoming a sideman with Joe Zawinul, cofounder of Weather Report. Face First, Tribal Tech's 1993 recording, was hailed "Fusion Album of the Year" by Tower Records' Pulse! magazine. Henderson's 1995 solc effort, Dog Party, won Guitar Player's "Best Blues Album" honors.

He started in Memphis in the '40s with HOWLIN' WOLF, B.B. KING, and MEMPHIS SLIM, and he's still cookin' in the '90s - the just-released solo album, "The Blues Don't Bother Me!" He went from being arguabley the leading guitarist on Beale Street in the '40s and '50s to the lead guitarist for the BLUES BROTHERS BAND in the '70s and '80s — the leap to fame.

Inbetween, there's a large slice of history, of music and of the blues - Chess Records session guitarist in the '50s and '60s; an integral part in the bands of HOWLIN' WOLF, MEMPHIS SLIM, and JAMES COTTON — with whom, in 1978, DAN AYKROYD and JOHN BELUSHI first saw, then recruited MURPHY to anchor the BLUES BROTHERS. Their work together produced the hit movie and three platinum albums.



MATT MURPHY'S inventive phrasings and guitar genius can be heard on the classic hits: SONNY BOY WILLIAMSON'S "Help Me" and "Bring It On Home," ETTA JAMES' "Something's Got a Hold On Me," and THE VIBRATIONS' "The Watusi"; and on CHUCK BERRY'S "Rockin' at the Hops" LP. He's also played and recorded with BUDDY GUY and MUDDY WATERS, and OTIS RUSH, BOBBY "BLUE" BLAND, KOKO TAYLOR, and JR. PARKER.

HARVEY BROOKS

He backed DYLAN on Highway 61 Revisited. That's him on "Like A Rolling Stone." He played

bass on Dylan's first tour in 1965, after Newport, when folk went electric. He backed THE DOORS on The Soft Panade. That's him on "Touch Me," The Doors' last, big hit single. He was recruited by MILES DAVIS for the groundbreaking Bitches Brew. He jammed with JIMI HENDRIX for years. He was part of two great American bands—the influential THE ELECTRIC FLAG of the late-'60s and the FABULOUS RHINESTONES of the mid-'70s. That's for openers.

His credits read like a music history's Who's Who. Legendary performances—Jim Morrison, Janis Joplin, B.B. King, Albert King, Buddy Guy, Judy Collins, Phil Ochs, "Mama" Cass Elliott, the Young Rascals, Richie Havens, Jefferson Airplane. Supersession, with Mike Bloomfield, Al Kooper, and Stephen Stills.

Harvey Brooks would never call himself a legend, but his work over the last 30 years speaks for itself. For, however far back he goes, he's moving forward—studying, songwriting, and recording. Currently, he can be heard on The Fabulous Thunderbirds latest album. Roll of the Dice, and on the soon-to-be released CD, Slo Leak, recorded with Charlie Karp and produced by Danny Kortchmar. Last year, No Ways Tired, a gospel record he made with Fontella Bass, was nominated for a Grammy.


